Reading from the Book of Tobit (4:7-11)

⁷“Give generously to anyone who faithfully obeys God. If you are stingy in giving to the poor, God will be stingy in giving to you. ⁸Give according to what you have. The more you have, the more you should give. Even if you have only a little, be sure to give something. ⁹This is as good as money saved. You will have your reward in a time of trouble. ¹⁰⁻
¹¹ Taking care of the poor is the kind of offering that pleases God in heaven. Do this, and you will be kept safe from the dark world of the dead.
